Colonel Sean Scott entered the United States Army in 1989 as a Distinguished Military Graduate of Montana State University's Reserve Officers' Training Corps. After completing the Military Intelligence Officer Basic Course he served in Panama as a battalion S-2 with the 92nd Military Police Battalion, and as an analyst, detachment commander, company commander and battalion S-1 with the 746th and 310th Military Intelligence Battalions. In Panama he participated in Operation Just Cause. He subsequently served in Naples, Italy as an operations officer with Region I of the 650th Military Intelligence Group, also known as the Allied Command Europe Counterintelligence Activity. From Italy he deployed in 1996 to Bosnia with the Allied Rapid Reaction Corps' Allied Military Intelligence Battalion, where he served first as a company operations officer and then as a section commander in support of Operation Joint Endeavor. In 1998 Colonel Scott received a Master's Degree in International Affairs from the University of Miami in Florida. He then served as Chief of the Office of Defense Cooperation at the U.S. Embassy in Tirana, Albania, where he participated in Operations Allied Force and Allied Harbor. After completing the Army's Command & General Staff College at Fort Leavenworth, Kansas in 2001, he was assigned to Fort Gordon, Georgia where he served as battalion S-3 and battalion XO of the 206th Military Intelligence Battalion. He next served as the assignment officer for military intelligence lieutenant colonels at the U.S. Army Human Resources Command in Alexandria, Virginia. Most recently he completed a tour as the U.S. Army Attache to Bulgaria.

Colonel Scott is a native of Washington State, and a graduate of Central Valley High School in Spokane, Washington. He is married to Trinh Nguyen, a former commander in the U.S. Public Health Service.

Colonel Scott's awards and decorations include the Defense Superior Service Medal, Defense Meritorious Service Medal (2nd award), Meritorious Service Medal (3rd award), Armed Forces Expeditionary Medal (2nd award), and Air Assault Badge.
