

Washington FY2016 AmeriCorps State & National Grant Coversheet

Below is a breakdown of the funding being awarded to Washington. The state competitive funding and state formula funding will be granted to Serve Washington, the governor-appointed State Service Commission. The Commission will, in turn, award grants to nonprofit organizations and/or public agencies responding to local needs across the state. In addition, funding is also being awarded to one or more national direct grantees, which are organizations headquartered in Washington that support AmeriCorps members serving in more than one state.

In addition to the grant funding awarded to organizations, AmeriCorps members who complete at least 1,700 hours of service will earn Segal AmeriCorps Education Awards valued at \$5,775. These awards may be used to pay for college or vocational training or to pay back student loans. Through these grants, AmeriCorps members are projected to earn up to \$8,285,064 in education awards to support their pursuit of higher education.

Below is a listing of the eight AmeriCorps competitive grants in Washington:

- **EarthCorps:** AmeriCorps members will provide watershed restoration services including invasive plant removal, native planting, and trail work in parks and natural areas primarily in King, Pierce and Snohomish counties. (*\$360,000 grant; 30 AmeriCorps members*)
- **College Access Now:** AmeriCorps members will provide college access coaching in school districts in Seattle, Highline, and South King County. (*\$384,900 grant, 30 AmeriCorps members*)
- **Washington State Department of Veterans Affairs:** AmeriCorps members will act as peer mentors, connecting veterans and military families to services and benefits at colleges and with community partner sites across the state. (*\$630,500 grant; 50 AmeriCorps members*)
- **Washington State Department of Ecology:** AmeriCorps members will remove invasive species and install native plants to improve habitat for fish and wildlife, improve access and safety of park trails, reduce the risk of floods and wildfires through forest health management, and assist in disaster response services in 18 counties across Washington. (*\$1.8 million grant; 285 AmeriCorps members*)
- **Washington Campus Compact:** AmeriCorps members will provide academic coaching and recruit college students to serve as College Access Coaches for economically disadvantaged K-12 youth in Washington and Oregon. (*\$672,000 grant; 56 AmeriCorps members*)
- **Mt. Adams Institute:** AmeriCorps members will engage in career development and stewardship programs focused on public lands and natural resources management resulting in more than 1,500 acres of improved public lands in 11 states including, Washington, Oregon, Missouri, Arkansas, Illinois, Indiana, Virginia, West Virginia, North Carolina, and South Carolina. (*\$499,489 grant; 58 AmeriCorps members*)
- **Washington State Employment Security Department** will receive two grants.
 - **Washington Reading Corps:** AmeriCorps members will provide reading tutoring to students in 75 high-needs schools and early learning centers throughout the state. (*\$1.8 grant; 150 AmeriCorps members*)
 - **Washington Service Corps:** AmeriCorps members will provide services at under-resources organizations that offer disaster-preparedness education, financial literacy education and job development services, enrichment activities, training about environmentally-conscious practices, information about health programs and volunteer opportunities for veterans. (*\$7.1 million grant; 567 AmeriCorps members*)

Below is a list of 11 grants through Serve Washington, the Governor-appointed state service commission. There are made possible by formula funding provided by CNCS:

- **City Year Seattle:** AmeriCorps members will provide academic and school engagement services to students in three public schools in Seattle. (\$338,800 grant; 28 AmeriCorps members)
- **College Success Foundation:** AmeriCorps members will improve students' college and career awareness and increase the schools' college-going culture in 17 middle schools in five school districts across the state. (\$234,000 grant; 18 AmeriCorps members)
- **Communities In Schools:** AmeriCorps members will provide a mix of school-based and individualized supports to students at risk of school failure through the delivery of school-based site coordinator services in schools across seven counties. (\$343,249 grant; 25 AmeriCorps members)
- **Community Youth Services:** AmeriCorps members will provide intensive services to at-risk youth and families in Thurston County. (\$274,600 grant; 20 AmeriCorps members)
- **Kitsap Community Resources:** AmeriCorps will act as a multi-focus intermediary in Bremerton, Port Orchard and Central Kitsap. (\$268,600 grant; 20 AmeriCorps members)
- **Life Works:** AmeriCorps members will act as a multi-focus intermediary serving in Cowlitz and Wahkiakum Counties. (\$335,750 grant; 25 AmeriCorps members)
- **NE WA Educational Service District101:** AmeriCorps members will engage economically disadvantaged young adults in service and education, while constructing low-income housing in Spokane County. (\$156,092 grant; 12 AmeriCorps members)
- **Pasco School District:** AmeriCorps members will improve academic performance among economically disadvantaged elementary school children in Benton and Franklin Counties. (\$274,599 grant; 20 AmeriCorps members)
- **Port Angeles School District:** AmeriCorps members will provide focused and strategic interventions in the form of academic tutoring and mentoring support in the Port Angeles and Crescent School Districts. (\$217,932 grant; 16 AmeriCorps members)
- **United Way King County:** AmeriCorps members will prevent and reduce homelessness by providing financial interventions to improve in housing readiness and financial resiliency in King County. (\$322,242 grant; 25 AmeriCorps members)
- **Northwest Leadership Foundation:** AmeriCorps members will mentor and tutor high-needs, underserved youth in Tacoma. (\$156,092 grant; 12 AmeriCorps members)
